ACT database is a visual image internet resource. The images may be used for research purposes.

Bible Gateway <http://www.biblegateway.com/>

A searchable online Bible (200+ versions, 70 languages). Free to read, research, and reference.

BIBIndex <http://www.biblindex.mom.fr/>

BibIndex is an index of biblical references found in Christian literature (currently: the three first centuries).

Cambridge Digital Library <http://cudl.lib.cam.ac.uk/>

Early printed books and manuscripts. Trinity Hall collection includes volumes on canon law and theology.

Christian Classics Ethereal Library <http://www.ccel.org/>

CCEL is an online source for classic Christian texts, including Early Church Fathers.

An aggregator of open access research papers from repositories and journals worldwide.

Directory of Open Access Books <http://doabooks.org/>

DOA Books is an online directory that indexes and provides access to academic, peer-reviewed books.

Directory of Open Access Journals <http://doaj.org/>

DOAJ provides access to high-quality, peer-reviewed journals; has a section for philosophy and religion.

A library of free eBooks. Main focus on older works for which U.S. copyright has expired.

Philosophy and related disciplines, such as Theology. Entries are maintained by experts in the field.
